General School Expectations

All members of the CET School Community will respect and be kind to everyone. This means:

1. **“CET will R.E.A.C.H for Knowledge”** Your behaviors and actions should represent our school-wide focus on **R**espect, **E**ffort, **A**cceptance, **C**ooperation and **H**onesty.
2. We are polite to our classmates, teachers, administrators, and other visiting adults and children in our school.
3. We follow the rules whether an adult is present or not.
4. We walk quietly in the hallways.
5. **We don't tease one another or call each other names because of how people look, what they believe in or how they act.**
6. We include others and do not leave anyone out.
7. We use appropriate language at all times.
8. We help one another.
9. We solve our problems with one another by **talking, not fighting or touching.**
10. We ask a teacher or other adult staff member for help if we have a problem we cannot solve on our own.
11. We are proud of our school and ourselves and we do not do anything to harm either.
12. We do not bring real or toy weapons, dangerous objects or electronic items (games, ipods, cell phones) to school.

Lunchtime Expectations



1. Listen to directions the first time they are given. Encourage others to listen to what is being announced.
2. Stay seated during lunch time. No switching seats or visiting at other tables.
3. Clean up your eating area when you are finished. Your eating area includes the floor.
4. Talk in a quiet voice to those children at your lunch table.
5. Ask for permission to visit the nurse. Take a bathroom pass, if needed.
6. Do not trade your food.
7. Keep your hands, feet, and other body parts to yourself.
8. Wait for your teacher to pick you up from lunch.
9. No electronic games or trading cards should be played during lunchtime. Electronic games are not allowed in school.

Recess Expectations

1. You can't say "You can't play."
2. Show good sportsmanship. No teasing, put-downs, harassment, or inappropriate language.
3. Use playground equipment correctly. Return the equipment (balls, Frisbees, skip-its, jump ropes, etc...) to the appropriate area. If you break or lose a piece of equipment, let a lunch monitor know.
4. Always stay where a monitor can see you.
5. Ask permission to use the bathroom or visit the nurse.
6. Respond quickly to the whistle.
7. Walk down the hill.
8. Line up safely and quietly at the end of recess.





Bus Expectations

In order that your bus rides to and from school stay safe, the following rules must be followed:

1. Always be respectful to the driver and the other students.
2. Sit according to your grade level. The youngest students sit in the front and the oldest in the rear. If you want to sit with a younger sibling, sit in their area.
3. Remain seated with your belongings in your backpack. No switching seats.
4. Talk quietly so as to not distract the driver.
5. Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself and inside the bus.
6. No throwing objects on the bus.
7. Use a seat belt if it is available.
