**Clubs and Activities**



<b><i>Shakespeare Club</i></b>
Members of this club read, act, and generally have fun doing Shakespeare plays on Thursday afternoons, 3:00-4:00, in room 120. We also produce a full-length Shakespeare play in February. Mr. Merriam is the advisor.
<b><i>Skate Club</i></b>
The mission of the CHHS Skate Club is to promote wellness through the activity of skateboarding and to promote a positive image of Skateboarding in the community. Mr. Ferrara is the advisor.
<b><i>Spanish Club</i></b>
The Spanish Club is designed to provide students with fun and informal exposure to the Spanish language and Hispanic cultures. The advisor is Ms. Ballina-Llosa.
<b><i>Stage Crew</i></b>
This club supports the various theatre productions throughout the school year by building, painting and moving sets. They also provide lighting and technical work and gather props. The advisor is Mr. Stevens.
<b><i>STAR Club</i></b>
The purpose of Students Together Against Racism (STAR) is to promote diversity, self-growth, and social change, as well as to educate members of our community on issues of race. <b><i>Student Task Force</i></b>
Students of CHHS will be a part of this club that is a student branch of the larger task force. They will be looking at how we can address societal and cultural issues in the school community. The advisor is Ms. Tracy.
<b><i>Tri-M Music Honor Society</i></b>
Through performance and community service, students develop confidence, creativity and other leadership skills. This club is open to all students who are enrolled in Band, Jazz Band, Chorus or Orchestra. Ms. Zantay is the advisor.
<b><i>Teen Leadership Council</i></b>
The Teen Leadership Council raises awareness about important issues and encourages others to make healthy choices. Members earn community service hours, act as role models, work with younger students and teens from other high schools, attend local and national youth conferences, organize assemblies, activities and events such as the Candlelight Vigil and Vassallo Fest. Mrs. Morales is the advisor.
<b><i>Yearbook</i></b>
Photographers, layout staff and writers are always needed. The advisors are Mr. Delaney and Mr. Stevens.

<b><i>Art Club</i></b>
This club is for students with an interest in visual art. The students will become involved in school beautification and art exhibitions. The advisor is Mr. Stevens.
<b><i>Big Buddy Program</i></b>
The primary goals of the program are twofold. The first is to provide a comfortable, easy transition for ninth graders entering the high school; the second is for juniors/seniors to act as positive role models and to demonstrate responsible leadership and empathy for the underclassmen. <b><i>Book Club</i></b>

<b><i>C.A.C.T.I.</i></b>
This club is an academic challenge team that competes against other teams in the area. The advisor of this club is Mr. Bowden.
<b><i>C.A.R.E Club</i></b>
Croton Awareness and Research Education Club raises money to donate to research institutes and promotes idiopathic disease awareness to CHHS students and faculty. The advisor is Ms. McConville.
<b><i>Chinese Club</i></b>
Chinese Club is designed to provide students with opportunities to learn about Chinese language and culture. Club activities include learning about Chinese holidays, Chinese food, Chinese movies. The club advisor is Ms. Wang-Paolicelli.
<b><i>Class Officers</i></b>
Officers are elected in the 10 <sup>th</sup> , 11 <sup>th</sup> and 12 <sup>th</sup> grade in the spring of the previous year. The offices of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer are directly tied into the CHAP program and the President serves as a class representative to the Student Faculty Congress. Freshmen class officers and representatives are elected in the fall. <b><i>Community Service / Interact Club</i></b>
The club encourages students to get involved in serving the community (school and town) and help them find opportunities to do so. The advisor is Mr. Xavier.

<b><i>Croton-Harmon Explorers Club</i></b>
Students with an interest and appreciation of the outdoors and fitness will explore their natural environment while learning a variety of skills. The club advisor is Mr. Lindner.
<b><i>Debate Club</i></b>
Debate Club is a great opportunity for students to prepare for life beyond the walls of CHHS through collaboration, argumentation, and participation in tournaments. The advisor is Ms. McConville.
<b><i>Destination Imagination</i></b>
D.I. is an educational program that teaches the creative process from Imagination to Innovation. <b><i>Drama Club</i></b>
