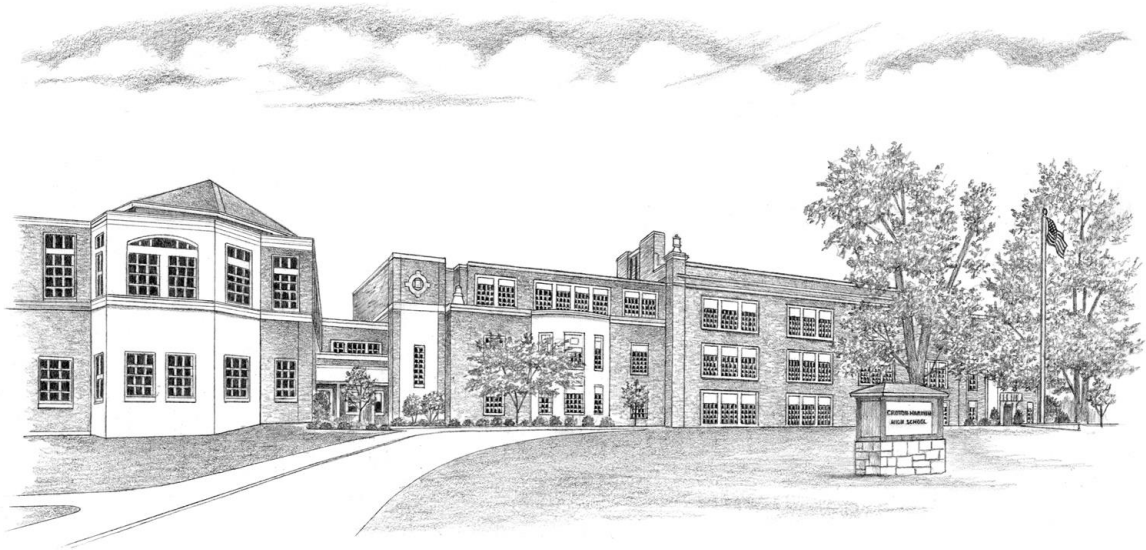

Administration

LAURA DUBAK is the principal of Croton-Harmon High School and this is her first year in Croton. She started her career as a high school English teacher in Brooklyn and then was an assistant principal for seven years including several years in high schools in Westchester County. She holds a B.S. in English and education from New York University, an M.Ed. from Harvard University in educational policy and management, and an M.Ed. from Columbia University Teachers College in school leadership and organization.

MARK MAXAM is the assistant principal of Croton-Harmon High School and the Director of Guidance. Mr. Maxam has worked in public education for 24 years, having served as a classroom teacher of Physics, Chemistry, Physical Science, and Earth Science, as well as an assistant principal. A Returned Peace Corps Volunteer, Mr. Maxam spent two years teaching Physics and Math in a rural High School in Kenya. Committed to helping improve conditions in education worldwide, Mr. Maxam served as the Executive Director of a nonprofit organization working in schools in Kenya for ten years, and continues to work and travel in East Africa. She also has a Masters of Arts in Teaching degree in Secondary English from the Graduate College of Union University.
