UPDATE April 2020: CHILD NUTRITION ACCOMMODATIONS DURING SCHOOL CLOSURE

The District will be providing Grab-and-Go and grocery-style lunch to our free and reduced meal eligible children during the school closure beginning March 18, 2020. Meals will be provided without charge and are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Student meals will be distributed from the Pierre Van Cortlandt Middle School's main entrance on Mondays and Thursdays between the hours of 11:30am and 12:30pm. Entry to the building will be through the main doors closest to the ramp and Welcome Center. The rest of the building will not be accessible.
